RESOLUTION NO. 2025-15

PASSED June 18th, 2025

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING A TEXT AMENDMENT TO RESOLUTION #32-10; SPECIFICALLY SECTION 25.9 TITLED “POLITICAL SIGNS”.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT; The Vermilion Township Board of Trustees, Erie County, State of Ohio amend Section #25.9 of Resolution 32-10, commonly referred to as the Vermilion Township Zoning Code, to now read;

“25.9 Political Signs

Political sign shall not be posted in any place or in any manner that is upon public property. Political sign shall not be posted within a public right-of-way of any public road, street or highway, nor shall any sign be posted upon or attached to any public utility pole regardless of the pole location. Political signs do not require a zoning permit, except where political signs are larger than 100 sq. ft. and are considered Commercial Signage or Billboards that may require a zoning permit and an appropriate safety inspection. Any signs posted in violation of this resolution shall be removed and stored at the Vermilion Township Road Department Garage for a period of thirty (30) days and may be destroyed after that time; if not claimed by the proper owner.
